Provo City, through the undersigned prosecutor, alleges BENJAMIN PAUL SCHNEIDER committed the following criminal offense(s) in Provo Utah:

COUNT 1: DISORDERLY CONDUCT, a class C misdemeanor, in violation of 76-9-102(2)+(3B), in that BENJAMIN PAUL SCHNEIDER on or about December 10, 2025 (a) refuse to comply with the lawful order of the police to move from a public place or an official meeting; or knowingly create a hazardous or physically offensive condition, by any act that serves no legitimate purpose; or (b) intending to cause public inconvenience, annoyance, or alarm, or recklessly create a risk of public inconvenience, annoyance, or alarm, did: (i) engage in fighting or in violent, tumultuous, or threatening behavior; (ii) make unreasonable noises in a public place or an official meeting; (iii) make unreasonable noises in a private place which can be heard in a public place or an official meeting; or (iv) obstruct vehicular or pedestrian traffic in a public place or an official meeting; and the violation occurred after the actor had been asked to cease conduct prohibited under this section.

COUNT 2: CRIMINAL TRESPASS AFTER NOTICE, a class B misdemeanor, in violation of 76-6-206(2B)+(3A), in that BENJAMIN PAUL SCHNEIDER on or about December 10, 2025 did, knowing that entry or presence or the unmanned aircraft's entry or presence was unlawful, enter or remain on property or caused an unmanned aircraft to unlawfully enter or remain over property as to which notice against entering was given by (i) personal communication to the actor by the owner or someone with apparent authority to act for the owner; (ii) fencing or other enclosure obviously designed to exclude intruders; or(iii) posting of signs reasonably likely to come to the attention of intruders.
